

I'm depicting the 823 artillery battles that took place in Kinmen, Matsu and other islands along the southeastern coast of mainland China from 1958 to 1979. I wanted to draw this event because I was very impressed by the history class in high school. Although it didn't like The 228 Incident was so large-scale, it was still the last large-scale military conflict between the land, navy and air force of China and Taiwan! Originally, China fired at Kinmen every day, but they abandoned the blockade and switched to shooting on single day, not shooting on even days, and finally stopped the war after the establishing of diplomatic relations with the United States. At that time, when the history teacher was teaching this war, I felt that the army in Kinmen was very powerful. They were not afraid of the attack launched by a country powerful of China, and they managed to defend in the end. It moved me to tears, as if I was fighting the war in it. In the end, I think that every war leaves a thrilling history for that era, and it also gives future generations a sense of the greatness of that time.
